How did it all begin?

A group of journalists were concerned about the lack of environmental awareness and its linkage to poverty in Zambia.

In 1997 The Greenhouse Foundation was founded to address this issue.

Three years later the focus broadened to also cover developmental challenges.

Green Living Movement was registered in 2000.
